









History of Maibauer Boulders

Carolina Climbers Coalition's purchase of the Maibauer Boulders secures 32 acres of hardwood forests topped with a compact cluster of high-quality boulders within the Brushy Mountains. Previously, access was only available to a small number of climbers who knew the landowner. Development of the Maibauer Boulders began in the 1990s. Today, more than 100 boulder problems can be found scattered along the ridge. These documented problems range from Vo-Vg including many excellent problems in the V3-V6 range.




- CCC purchased 32 acre boulder field via Access Fund loan

Raven Rock and Hickory Creek Boulders

- CCC worked with land owners on access agreement in 2023.
- Gate code/ waiver required.
- Raven Rock has amazing single pitch 5.7-5.13, ice climbs, and bouldering.
- Hickory Creek is all bouldering, up to V10 and is outlined in new bouldering guidebook.
- Park smart.
- \$50,000 project, we have raised \$41,000.

- We have completed the parking lot build, started graffiti removal, started invasive removal, started anchor updates, and started trail work.

Table Rock base trail project is an on-the-ground example of the Plan in motion




Table Rock Climbers' Access Trail Project

Project Timeline:

- Wild South started NEPA work for all of Linville Gorge around 2018.
- Table Rock Climbers Access Trail passed NEPA in 2020.
- Goal; build the trail to handle the traffic it receives, mitigate off trail trampling.
- CCC worked to achieve NC RTP grants, National Forest Foundation grant, Access Fund, and AAC grants.
- CCC hired the Access Fund and Conservation Corps of NC to work on the trail.
- Wild South worked on much of the trail near Devils Cellar.
- COME OUT AND HELP FINISH THE TRAIL October 14th, 19th.
